## CITY OF THORNDALE RESOLUTION #23-07

## HAZARD MITIGATION PLAN ADOPTION RESOLUTION

WHEREAS the City of Thorndale has experienced repetitive disasters that have damaged commercial, residential and public properties, displaced citizens and businesses, closed streets and bridges dividing the community both physically and emotionally, and presented general public health and safety concerns; and

WHEREAS the community has prepared a Hazard Mitigation Plan that outlines the communities' options to reduce overall damage and impact from hazards; and

**WHEREAS**, the Hazard Mitigation plan has been reviewed by the community residents, business owners, and federal state and local agencies, and has been revised to reflect their concerns;

## NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT:

- 1. The Hazard Mitigation Plan is hereby adopted as an official plan of the City of Thorndale.
- 2. The Hazard Mitigation Plan should be adopted / revised every 5 years.
- 3. A hazard mitigation Planning Group is hereby established as a permanent community advisory body. The Emergency Management Coordinator shall lead the advisory planning group and shall serve a one-year term. The group's duties shall be as designated in the Hazard Mitigation Plan.
- 4. The Emergency Management Coordinator is charged with supervising the implementation of the Plan's recommendations within the funding limitations as provided by the City Council of the City of Thorndale or other sources.
- 5. The Emergency Management Coordinator shall give priority attention to the following action items recommended by the Hazard Mitigation Plan
  - a. Upgrade early warning system
  - b. Upgrade city emergency operations center
- 5. The Emergency Management Coordinator shall convene the hazard mitigation planning group quarterly. The planning group shall monitor implementation of the plan and shall submit a written progress report to the Thorndale City Council in accordance with the following format:
  - a. An annual review and/or update of the original plan
  - b. A review of any disaster or emergencies that occurred during the previous calendar year
  - c. A review of the actions taken, including what was accomplished during the year
  - d. A discussion of any implementation problems
  - e. Recommendations for new projects or revised action items. Such recommendations shall be subject to approval by the City Council of the City of Thorndale.
  - f. Submit a copy of the review to the Central Texas Council of Governments to be forwarded to The Governor's Division of Emergency Management and the Federal Emergency Management Agency.
